Falls Recruiter's Sports Car For Sale

CUYAHOGA FALLS — For sale: One "Hackmobile."

Army Recruiter S-Sgt. David Hack has announced he's going to part with his 1960 souped-up red, white and blue Corvette with "Uncle Sam Wants You" posters painted on the hood and trunk.

The car was one of several flamboyant recruiting gimmicks Hack used trying to boost monthly enlistments at his Front st. recruiting station.

He spent his own money on the Hackmobile, all in the cause of recruiting for the

Army, for which he has gained nationwide attention.

BUT NOW he says he wants to move onto other things. Hack said the car, valued at \$5,000, will be raffled off at the Cleveland Auto Show on Feb. 4. Tickets will be sold throughout the Akron area beginning next week, he said.

Money from the sale will all go back into the "cause," Hack said.

"I hate to part with it," he said, "but the cause justifies it. I need the money to give away more T-shirts."

HACK HAS commissioned the production of thousands of T-shirts, all bearing the message: "Sgt. Hack Wants You For The U. S. Army." He gives them away.

Hack said proceeds from the car sale also will be used to start a "Sgt. Hack Talk Show" and open a nonprofit pizza shop to be run by teenagers.
